

(Q7)**




As of March 31, 2021 (Q7)

Grant-Funded Training Reminder

Training for: public safety personnel, including call-takers, first responders, and other individuals and organizations who are part of the emergency response chain in 911 services.

Per the Notice of Funding Opportunity, all grant-funded training must satisfy two requirements:

Meet minimum training guidelines for telecommunicators

911 Grant Program Reminders

- Allowable services charged to the grant must only include the costs of the services delivered **within** the grant period of performance.
- Example: reimbursements for contracted GIS services cannot include the cost of services past March 2022

Grant-Funded Service Contracts



- Federal and match expenditures must meet the same allowability requirements
- Example: if an activity is ineligible as a Federal expenditure, grantees may not report the cost as match

Federal Vs. Match Expense Allowability



- 2 CFR 200 requires grantees to report equipment purchases valued at \$5,000 or more
- During the closeout process, grantees submit SF-428 (next page) for equipment purchases at or above the \$5,000 threshold

Reminders for Grantees With Subrecipients

Subaward Agreements



- Subaward agreements should identify funding as a subaward under Federal grant
- Must include terms and conditions outlined in 2 CFR 200
- Subaward agreements must reflect statutory non-diversion requirements of the grant

Property Reporting Requirements



- Pass through-entities are subject to the same property reporting requirements as all other grantees
- Subrecipients collect and report the relevant property purchase information for inclusion in the grantee's closeout package
