911 LEGISLATION NEWS: LAWS ENACTED DURING 2012

NCSL Provides Up-to-Date Tracking of 911 Legislation

(Washington, D.C.) –March 4, 2013 – Would you like to know what kind of 911 laws were passed during 2012? Are you interested in finding out which states are updating their 911 statutes? A resource is now available to assist State and local PSAP Managers, 911 Authorities, legislators and local and regional officials nationwide in keeping track of legislative changes affecting 911 services. An aggregate list of key 2012 enactments has been posted on the 911 Legislation Tracking Database at [NCSL 911 Legislative Database](#).

The National 911 Program has partnered with the National Conference of State Legislators (NCSL) to create this online national database of introduced and enacted 911 legislation. The legislative database, which is searchable by state, topic, keyword, year, status or primary sponsor, is updated bi-weekly and topics include:

- 911 Administration, Plans, Boards & Commissions
- 911 Fee, Service Fee or Surcharge
- 911 Funding and Appropriations
- 911 Privacy and Confidentiality
- Enhanced 911
- Next Generation/Advanced 911
- Wireless 911
- 911 Other/Miscellaneous
